Principal's Report

Term 3 is well underway and there is a lot happening at Blayney High School over the coming weeks as we approach the school holiday period.

I would like to take the opportunity to thank all our students, parents, caregivers and staff for participating in the Uniform Consultation Surveys throughout Term 2. Throughout Term 3, the P&C have met on several occasions to review the results from these surveys and discuss options around proposed changes to the Blayney High School uniform. While there was strong support to update the school polo shirt, the supply and cost of a new school polo shirt has proven to be problematic due to minimum order requirements. Various options have been explored through a number of suppliers. As such, the P&C, in consultation with the school has made the decision not to proceed with an updated school polo shirt currently. We will continue to work with the P&C on a strategy to make improvements to our existing uniform and continue to explore updating our uniform into the future.

I would like to congratulate our schools Show Team who travelled to Dubbo last week to participate in the Wether Challenge. Each of these students worked tirelessly, in their own time over the past 6 months, to feed and care for the wethers. The Show Team came in 2nd place in their restocking class, which is a testament to their hard work and dedication. The challenge also provided students with the opportunity to participate in workshops offered by industry professionals, applying their learning and skills to real world experiences.

Last week, our Science and Engineering Team travelled to Newcastle to participate in the State Finals of the Science and Engineering Challenge, after winning the regional round in March. Students were involved in working with electrical circuits, examining earthquake structures, building gliders, mapping string lines, constructing moon buggies and bridges as well as deciphering codes. The students did themselves extremely proud, placing fourth in this prestigious competition. Thank you also to Ms Cochrane, Mr Colson and Mr Connell who took the students away for this three day event.

Our Year 11 students are currently hard at work preparing for their end of course examinations which commence in Week 9. Students have just finalised their school-based assessment for their courses and are engaged in structured revision in preparation for these examinations. We wish all our Year 11 students the very best. These examinations will provide them with important feedback about their achievement in Stage 6, which will allow them to set learning as they move into the HSC in Term 4.

The conclusion of Term 3 is filled with mixed emotions for Year 12 students and their teachers. While we celebrate Year 12 student's final weeks of their formal education, we also reflect on their contribution to our school over the last 6 years. Last week Year 12 students received important information regarding our school's expectations of them during their final weeks of school as well as important information about upcoming events and requirements for their HSC examinations. We hope that all our Year 12 students enjoy the events that are planned in recognition of the significant milestone – completion of 13 years of schooling.






What is Permanency Support?

Permanency Support is about offering long term love and stability to vulnerable children and young people. Ideally this is with their birth and extended family, but where this is not possible, Veritas House works to pair children with foster carers who provide a safe, secure home, bearing the responsibilities of a parent, for however long a child may need care.

What are the types of Foster Care?

Who can become a carer?

People from all walks of life can apply to be a carer, regardless of their different backgrounds, beliefs, life experiences and family types. You must be an Australian citizen or a permanent resident in good health. You and your household will be required to pass a series of checks including Police and Working with Children Checks, and complete initial training prior to becoming authorised as a carer.

Do I have what it takes?

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There is no such thing as the 'perfect carer'. Every carer is different, just as every child is different and we take time to pair carers and children accordingly. Regardless of your age, income, employment, marital status, or otherwise, your commitment to caring for a child and providing a safe home is what matters most. Children enter care for a myriad of reasons. Generally, they have experienced a degree of trauma through no fault of their own, which required intervention and removal for their own safety and wellbeing. If you have an understanding of the impact of trauma on a child and a willingness to learn more about this, you can make an incredible difference in a child's life.

Will I receive support?

Veritas House provides ongoing training, education and support to all of its foster carers, including help with maintaining birth family connection, a 24-hour telephone support line, some financial assistance and regular respite. Every child in care is paired with a dedicated caseworker who walks alongside them and their carer to provide practical and emotional support in a variety of different ways.


